

Proceedings of the State Level DISHA Committee meeting held on 15.07.2023 at 11.00 AM in conference Hall Secretariat under the Chairmanship of Hon'ble Chief Minister, Himachal Pradesh.

At the outset Hon'ble Rural Development & Panchayati Raj Minister Shri Anirudh Singh welcomed the Hon'ble Chief Minister Sh. Sukhvinder Singh, Chairman of DISHA Committee & other participants and asked the Secretary (RD)-cum- Member Secretary to brief about the progress of State Level DISHA Committee meeting.

The Secretary (RD)-cum- Member Secretary apprised the DISHA Committee that out of 77 Centrally Sponsored Schemes, about 72 Centrally Sponsored Schemes are being implemented in the State.

During the State Level DISHA Committee meeting, following Centrally Sponsored Schemes were discussed:

1. National Highway Authority of India (NHAI):-

The Project Director, National Highway authority of India apprised the Committee that the works of four laning from Parwanoo to Solan and Solan to Kaithlighat is under construction. It was apprised that as per NHAI norms, speed limit of four lane in hilly area is 60 KM/ per hour but the speed limit has been kept 40 KM/ per hour for safety reason for hilly area.

- Hon'ble CM enquired about the condition of the Parwanoo Solan Kaithlighat stretch in light of the recent spell of heavy rainfall in the state. PD Shimla apprised the Hon'ble CM that the stretch is open to traffic and atleast 1 lane is operational on complete stretch as on date.

The chairman mentioned that the stretch between Parwanoo to Solan should have median with width of 2.5 meters and above. Also, it was mentioned that the stretch between Parwanoo to Kaithlighat consist of vertical cutting which

results in frequent rock falls and landslides. It was directed that NHAI shall explore new alignment for Chandigarh-Shimla highway avoiding unstable hill cutting and repeated curves so that straighter alignment with higher design speed can be achieved.

- The chair enquired about the status of 4 laning of the Shimla Matur NH. It was apprised by the NHAI officials that the stretches between Kangra Bypass to Bhangbar (Pkg VB) and from Bhangbar to ChilBahl (Pkg IV) are already under construction. The work of Hamirpur Bypass has already been awarded and the construction is yet to be commenced due to pendency of Forest Clearance. The DPR for the stretch from NauniChowk to Shalaghat has been prepared by the DPR consultant as per four lane configuration. The four laning of stretch between NauniChowk to Shalaghat shall result in reduction of length by about 18km.
- The chairman was also updated that the DPR for the stretch between Shalaghat to Shimla is under preparation and the work for the DPR of the link road between Shimla Matur and Shimla Bypass shall be started soon.
- The chairperson also enquired about the status of Shimla Bypass (Pkg 1) and Pkg (2). PD Shimla apprised Hon'ble CM that the work for Package 1 i.e from Kaithlight to Shakralla has already commenced and will be completed in 3 years. However the Appointed Date for Package 2 of Shimla Bypass is pending due to pendency of Forest Clearance.
- Hon'ble member cum MLA Indora raised the issue of closure of Chakki-PuhalPathankot Mandi highway, traffic is diverted and road is damaged, the NHAI authorities assured to get the needful done.

Decision / suggestions :- It was emphatically directed by the chair to complete the four lane in a given timeline. The detailed Power Point Presentation (PPT) be presented before the Hon'ble Chief Minister within a month. Directions were also given to NHAI & PWD collectively by the Chair to ensure RCC structure and 45

degree angle of repose(in hills). Also NHAI authorities were directed that speed boards should be installed @ 500 mt. by NHAI on Kiratpur-Manali road. The chairperson directed that Raison to Manali was the worst affected road hence efforts must be made by NHAI. The chairperson asked the NHAI officials if the load of 16 tyre truck could be borne during apple season and they assured the chair accordingly.

2. Public Works Department (PWD):-

The Engineer-in Chief (PWD) apprised the house that the objective of Pradhan Mantri Gram Sadak Yojana (PMGSY) is to provide connectivity, by way of all weather roads to the unconnected habitations in the rural areas with a population of 500+ persons in Plain areas and 250+ in Hilly states as per 2001 census and maintenance cost of the project cost for 5 years after completion of road is to be borne by the State. Under Pradhan Mantri Gram Sadak Yojana (PMGSY) in Phase I, II & III, total 3497 works are completed and 230 works are pending in the State and length of 21157 K.M. has been achieved and rest of 1137 kms is in progress.

Decision/suggestion :- It was decided that length audit of roads should be done in current financial year and Revenue Department was asked to co-ordinate with Public Works Department in order to make a detailed Act for provision of possession of land in the name of Public Works Department wherever govt. funds have been spent to ensure that roads are transferred in the name of department and there are less litigations.

3. Social Justice and Empowerment Department:-

The Secretary (SJE) apprised the Chairman that as per National Social Assistance Programme (NSAP) guidelines, 100% funds are allocated by the Centre for a fixed target of beneficiaries with the direction to provide extra financial assistance and

cover the extra eligible beneficiaries from the State exchequer. Accordingly the State covers extra beneficiaries over & above the cap fixed by Centre and provide top-up amount in SSP of NSAP beneficiaries.

Under **Pradhan Mantri Adarsh Gram Yojana (PMAGY)**, 225 (Rev. villages) (Sirmaur 125, Solan 100) were selected in the year 2010-11 under Pilot phase, a total amount of Rs 49.50 Crore (45.00 Crore Centre + 4.5 Crore State) @22.0 Lakhs each village was released for undertaking gap filling activities in the villages having a minimum population of 200 and >50% is SC population. All these villages have been declared as “**Adarsh Gram**” in the year 2020. 2nd Phase of PMAGY Scheme has been launched in 2018-19 under which 458 villages (till 2022-23) across the State having population of >500 and >40% SC, have been selected and Rs 20.0 Lakh per village is to be provided for gap filling activities. Out of these, 179 villages have been declared as “Adarsh Gram” and Village Development Plan of 280 have been finalized and grounding of works is under progress.

Detailed discussion was on NSAP, PMAGY, ICDS and Mission Vatsalaya were held. In ICDS State has introduced a top-up scheme named BalPoshahar Yojana. The Director WCD apprised that under the SukhAashraya Yojana 50 applications for studies, 8 for housing and 24 applications have been received for higher education of destitute children/orphan/ semi-orphans and 238 children have been admitted in child care institutions. Under phase-II of the scheme (2017-18).

Decision / suggestions:-It was directed by the chair to achieve the targets timely and ensure timely utilization of funds. Directions were given to make fixed deposit of amount lying with the department under Sukhashrya Yojana (state top-up in Mission Vatsalaya scheme). The Chairman further directed to apprise the status of Modern Integrated complexes for orphans, destitute women and Senior Citizens in Jawalamukhi in District Kangra and Sundernagar in District Mandi and also stated that the concerned agency must be asked to submit the Detailed Project Report (DPR) within 3 days; if the concerned agency fails to do so, the same is to be handed over to the Public Works Department. Further status of admission of orphan students in St.

Stephens college was sought. It was directed to guide the students to prepare for admissions to prestigious colleges and efforts must be made by the department to get students admitted through management quota if exams have been held for college. The chair directed the officers of the department to finalise SOPs immediately. Directions were given to settle all NSAP disputes at the earliest. It was suggested that the anganwaricentres need to be upgraded in the state and accordingly proposal to be sent to the Govt. of India.

4. Department of Health & Family Welfare:-

The Secretary (Health) apprised the Chairman that 08 Medical Colleges including AIIMS and Private Medical College under National Health Mission (NHM) are operational in the state. Besides this, 2925 various health centres including district hospitals are being run under National Health Mission in State. Diagnosis is free and block level and district level labs have been established. It was informed that the recruitment of 780 number of Accredited Social Health Activist (ASHA) workers is in progress which will be done at sub-division level based on the norms of Gram Panchayat population. It was stated that MRI in IGMC is not functioning properly. 175 Hydraulic beds in IGMC are in good condition. Infant mortality rate of the state is good and immunisation is 100 %. Male Health workers cadre has been declared as dying cadre hence less number of MHWs are there.

Decision / suggestions : The department was directed to make provision of MRI for AIIMS and Super Speciality Hospital Chamyana, Shimla and float tenders for MRI's immediately. It was also directed to submit a proposal for maintaining ratio of Doctors in 10:1 & 6:1 for Staff Nurse in Emergency (Casualty) Ward and 03 shifts in day and Night of Emergency Ward in Indira Gandhi Medical College, (IGMC), Shimla. 3 TESLA and CT scan machine be installed immediately which scans 256 patients per day and also latest equipments of various Laboratory Tests identified by the department be installed immediately.

5. Jal Shakti Vibhag:

Secretary of Jal Shakti Vibhag (JalJeevan Mission) informed that the State Level Scheme Sanctioning Committee (SLSC) has given approval for 1742 schemes in the State, amounting to an estimated Rs. 5757.79 crore. Among these schemes, 340 have already been successfully completed, and the remaining 1402 are currently in progress with the target of completion proposed for March 2024. Notably, Himachal Pradesh stands as the 9th State in India and the first hilly State to achieve an outstanding feat of 100% saturation, ensuring Functional Household Tap Connections for all households.

Decision / suggestions:-Direction was given to enhance the capacity of water storage tanks at the source level, both in rural and urban areas. This measure will enable continuous water lifting from the pumping stations, ensuring a consistent supply of water. Furthermore, it was suggested to bring the water supply levels in rural areas at par with those in urban areas. To achieve this, schemes in rural areas need to be designed at 135 Liters Per Capita per Day (LPCD), ensuring equitable and improved water access for all residents.

7. Revenue Department:

The Director (Land Records) explained in detail to the Committee that the Survey of villages and mapping with improvised technology in village areas (SVAMITVA) was implemented since April, 2020 to provide an integrated property validation for rural India demarcating the “*abadideh*” area through drone survey technology. This will provide the record of rights to village households owners possessing houses in inhabited “*abadideh*” area in villages. The Director (Land Records) further apprised the Committee that district Hamirpur was taken on pilot basis and large scale mapping is completed in district Hamirpur and scale mapping is in progress in remaining districts. Out of 15197 *AbadiDeh* villages, drone based mapping has been completed in 6471 villages upto May, 2023. MoU has been signed

with the Survey of India by state for providing technological support. A State govt. initiative was highlighted by the Director Land Records of linking the Digilocker with property card. Also detailed information was provided about digital modernisation of land record. The cadastral maps have been digitised in 9 districts however before placing it in public domain proof reading is going on.

Decision / suggestions: The department was directed to strengthen the capacity of drone technology for mapping of *AbadiDeh* villages. Further department should explore the process of online integrated registry and mutation on the analogy of Andhra Pradesh, Telangana and Tamilnadu. The department raised the issue of lack of funding for geo-referencing of cadastral maps of villages. It was also apprised that due to adverse weather conditions, the task of drone mapping is hindered.

6. Urban Development Department:

Director Urban Development explained that the Smart Cities Mission is an ambitious programme of GoI. The mission aims to cover 100 cities which includes Shimla and Dharamshala from Himachal Pradesh. It was informed that the timeline for completion is June, 2024 and 500.00 crore is likely to be released by GoI. Another scheme being implemented by UD is Pradhan Mantri Awaas Yojana (Urban)(PMAY-U) is Centrally sponsored Scheme in the ratio of 90:10. The financial assistance of per unit is Rs.1.85 lakh including 35,000/- state top-up.

Decision/suggestions : The department was directed by the Chair to complete the project under smart city and to utilise the funds under given time line so as to promote Ease of Living. The department suggested that the GoI may be requested to enhance financial assistance under housing scheme to at least 2 lac. The chair directed that cost of a dwelling unit be enhanced from 1.50 lakh to 2.00 per unit in Urban and Rural areas and accordingly requested the GOI to consider the same.

7. Education Department:

The National Programme Nutritional support to primary education, popularly called Mid-day-Meal scheme was launched on 15th August, 1995 in the State of Himachal Pradesh. The GoI has re-named the said scheme during the year 2021-22 as Pradhan Mantri PoshanSshaktiNirman (PM-Poshan). The scheme is being implemented in the ratio of 90:10 between Centre and State.

The SamagraShiksha scheme was launched in the year 2018 as an integrated scheme for school education catering from pre-primary to Senior Secondary classes. The scheme is being implemented in the ratio of 90:10 between Centre and State. It was appraised that out of 03 components viz. Elementary, Secondary, Teacher Education, 50% funds are being utilised through Elementary Education.

Decision / suggestions: There are total number of 21478 CCHs working in HP State under PM Poshan Scheme. The GoI is providing an amount of Rs 900 per month per CCH of honorariums whereas the State is providing Rs 4000 per month to them. That is Rs 100 as ten percent matching State share and Rs 3000 as top up by State Government. It is therefore requested that the GOI may be requested in view of high inflation Rs 4000 per month per CCH honorarium central assistance to HP State may be provided. In this regard it is pertinent to mention here that out of total CCH 85 percent are female workers and more so all CCH belong to very poor families, widows, destitutes, BPL, handicaped.

8. Agriculture department:

Rashtriya Krishi Vikas Yojana (RKVY) is being implemented in the State since 2006 to achieve the 4% growth rate in agriculture and allied sectors. It was appraised that 14 various schemes/ components are being implemented by the department. Besides this, Agriculture Technology Management Agency (ATMA) is also being implemented by the department. The scheme is being implemented in the ratio of 90:10 started on pilot basis in the year 1998. Almost all farmers in the state are small & marginal farmers.

Decision / suggestions: It was directed by the Chairman to utilise the funds well in time. Interim utilisation certificates be sent to GOI.

9. Department of Technical Education:-

The MD HPKVN informed the DISHA committee that the Pradhan Mantri Kaushal Vikas Yojana is a centrally sponsored scheme being implemented in the State and is being funded 100% by the GoI. It was further informed that the scheme comprises 100% free of cost training spanning over 3-5 months. It was also apprised that the target under PMKVY- 3.0 was achieved in Jan. 2023 and target under 4.0 will be achieved by August, 2024.

Decision / suggestions: The Chairman directed HPKVN to explore starting training on themes in consonance with current market trends.

10. Department of Animal Husbandry:-

It was apprised by the Director Animal Husbandry that Rashtriya Gokul Mission is being implemented by the department and all the funds under the schemes have been utilised and merely 22.00 lakh under (NPBB) is left to be utilised in the current financial year. It was also informed that 2.50 crore has been received from the GoI for purchase of LN2 (Liquid Nitrogen) container.

Decision / suggestions: It has been directed by the Chairman to strengthen the artificial insemination programme and also to strengthen the AI facilities in rural areas. The Secretary, Animal Husbandry informed that the issue of fund discontinuation of medicines for animals under RKVY must be raised through the DISHA committee as it was a very beneficial grant and should be continued.

11. Horticulture:

Pradhan Mantri Krishi Sinchayee Yojana (PMKSY) Per Drop More Crop was launched in 1st July, 2015 aims to achieve convergence of investment in irrigation

sectors at field level. The motto of *HarKhetKoPani* is to ensure optimal use of water resources.

Decision/ suggestion:- It was directed by the Chair to utilise the funds in time bound manner.

12. Department of Panchayati Raj:

The Director Panchayati Raj informed that the 15th Finance Commission has recommended Rs. 2102.00 crore to be spent for a period of 6 years from 2020-21 to 2025-26. The Commission in its final report has recommended that 40% of the grant will be basic (untied) and can be used by the PRI's for felt needs under 29 subjects listed in the 11th schedule except for salaries and establishment cost.

Decision Taken:- It was directed by the Chair to utilise the funds at Gram Panchayat level and ensure not to park funds at any level.

13. Rural Development Department:-

The Director, Rural Development apprised the Committee that the State has provided 100 to 120 days guaranteed wage employment days in every financial year to persons who demand work under Mahatma Gandhi National Rural Employment Guarantee Act (MGNREGA). Further the Committee was briefed that in view of the current disaster situation prevailing in the state, directions were issued to field functionaries to include admissible works in the shelf and seek ex post- facto approval of gram sabha so as to provide immediate relief to the people in distress.

Decision :- The chairman directed the department to explore the possibility of marking the attendance of un-skilled labourers through Bio-Metric machine at Gram Panchayat level in order to avoid and check absentee/proxy attendance of unskilled worker and to enhance the progress of the work. In view of the damage caused by heavy rains and flashfloods in the state, Special Gram Sabhas in all gram panchayats be convened.

Further the Chairman of State Level DISHA Committee meeting s directed all the departments to come up with latest status in the next meeting and also ensure to utilise the funds well in time to avoid any lapses. He passed directions to all administrative secretaries and Head of departments to increase efficiency in the implementation of centrally sponsored programmes in the state. He further directed that work should not be handled in a routine manner but with meticulous planning and speedy implementation. Further absolute transparency should be ensured so as to curb any leakages or corruption at any level.

The meeting ended with a vote of thanks from the chair and to the chair.
